NOTES: The moratorium on commercial evictions has been extended to September 30, 2021 in California. State law controls what San Francisco and all local governments can do with respect to laws governing commercial landlords and tenants, and Governor Newsom's [Executive Order N-08-21](#) extended the timeframe for protections stated in previous Executive Orders. **The moratorium does not waive the obligation to pay missed rent.** If you have a business that has missed rent in the past year, we want to make sure you have time to prepare a repayment plan. To answer your questions and ensure you have all the resources you need, we'll be hosting a webinar with the Bar Association of San Francisco. There will be a live Q&A with legal experts during this webinar. You may also submit a question in advance when you register.

NOTES: Pop-up test sites are deployed to various neighborhoods most impacted by COVID-19, in partnership with community organizations. Sites and locations can change every 2 weeks, according to need. Only pop-up test sites with expected capacity are listed. During the current COVID-19 surge, there are longer than normal wait times. Drop-ins may be limited toward the end of the day, to make sure all testing is done properly. Sites may also close if it's raining. Test specimens need to be kept dry. These sites offer COVID-19 testing to minors under the age of 13 with guardian or parental consent. At the test sites, clinicians can also teach parents how to take a sample for their children.
