NOTES: San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) is opening-up COVID-19 boosters to all adults 18 years and older, provided they qualify based on timing of the previous dose of the vaccine. No one should be turned away if they feel they are at risk of COVID-19 and would like to get a booster in advance of the holiday season. Pfizer and Moderna recipients may receive a booster 6 months after their second dose in alignment with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) guidance this week to local jurisdictions for patients to self-determine their risk of exposure. Previously, per federal and state guidance only certain categories of higher risk individuals were recommended to receive a booster. Additionally, all Johnson & Johnson recipients should receive a booster two months after their previous dose, a criterion that remains the same.
